Topic of the **20th magazine** of the TV series “Step by step” is the convergence of local self-governments to citizens’ needs.

The first story is from Rekovac

While he was living in Kragujevac, Sava Milojevic needed to travel all the way to his home village Zupanjevac to get a birth certificate. Soon, however, residents of Rekovac villages will be able to get personal documents in all places. The local Municipality is completing the digitalization of birth records and they will soon be included into the republic system that now links over 27 Serbian towns and municipalities.

The second story is from Kraljevo

Suzana Vujcic is born and lives in a Roma settlement near the city’s center. For years, her family and their neighbors have been drinking and using water from the only local public tap. Two years ago, the settlement was connected to the public water supply and sewage system, in line with the Kraljevo’s Strategy of Roma settlement urban planning.

The third story comes from Belgrade

Nikola Djordjevic is the first blind person in the city with a software engineering diploma. He is working with a large telecommunications company and is volunteering for the Belgrade organization of blind people. He is now mounting the sounding system of the organization, for which he has sought financial assistance of the city’s Agency for European Integration and Cooperation with Associations.
